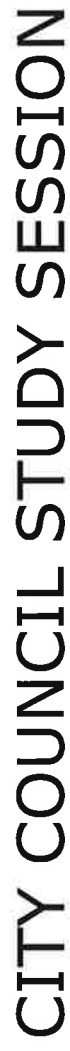

The Des Moines Pool Metropolitan Park District is in the process of completing an Aquatic Feasibility Study to address future needs and options. The scope of their Study includes review of potential new sites and facilities in addition to review of their current operations.

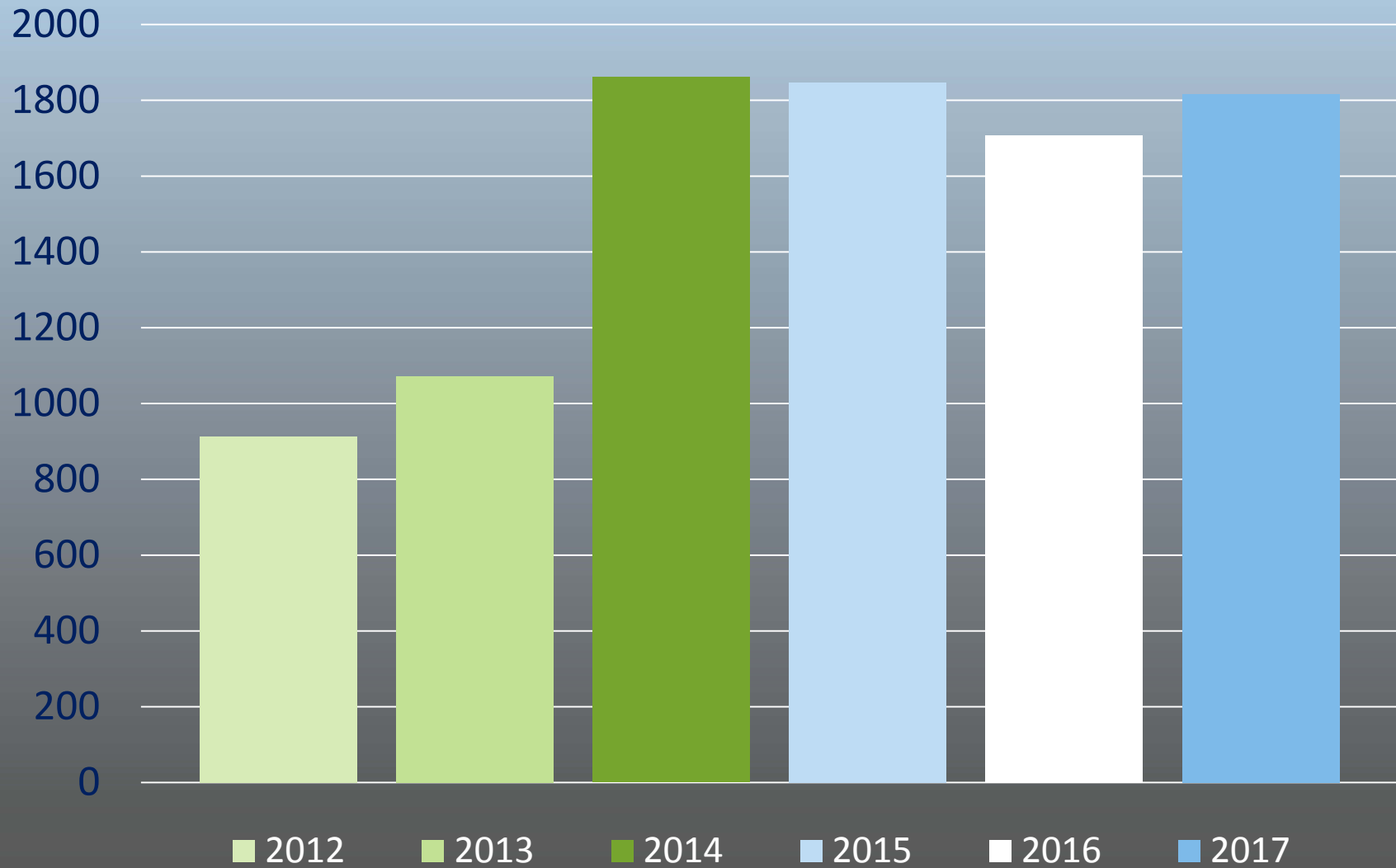

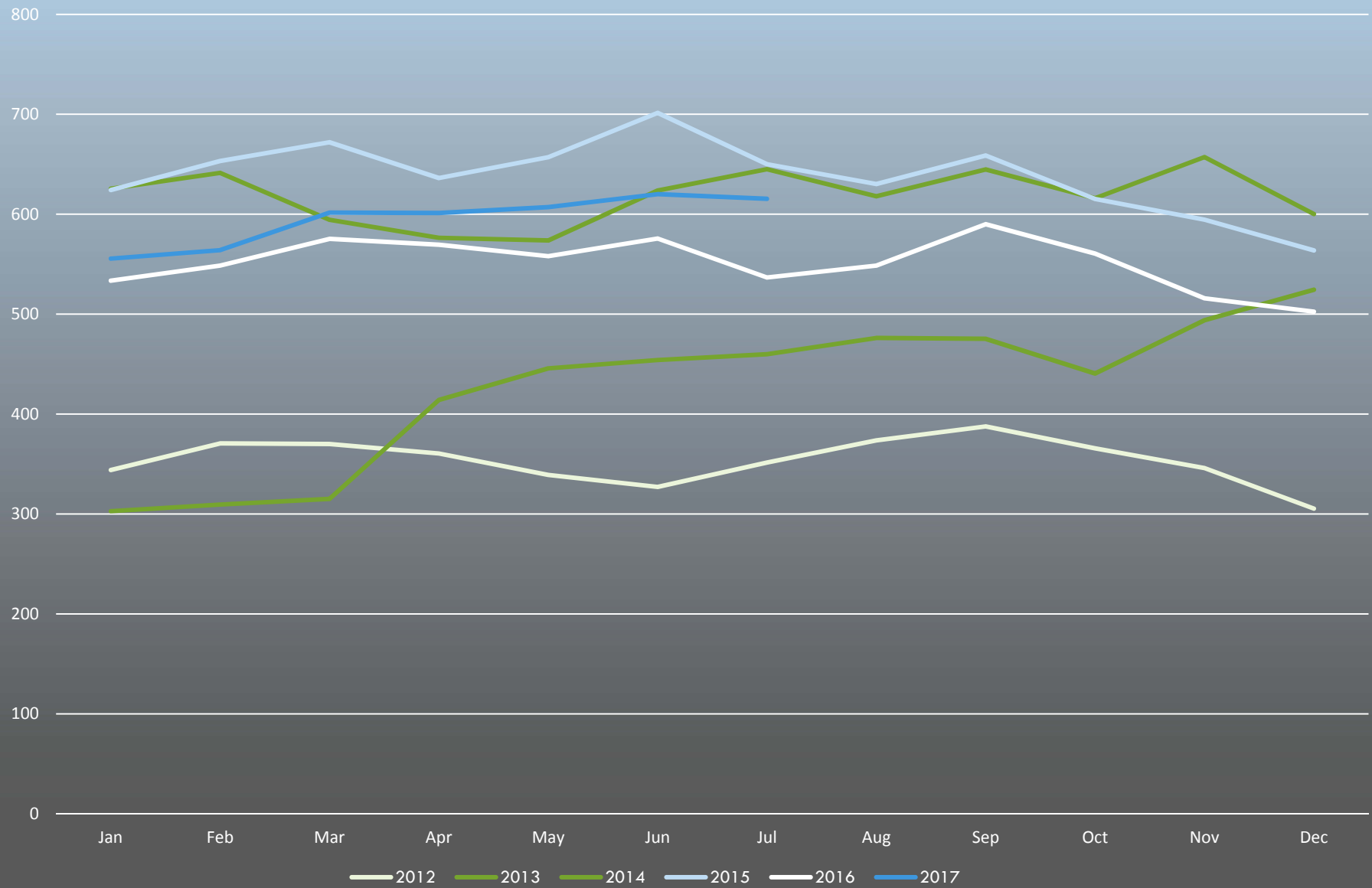

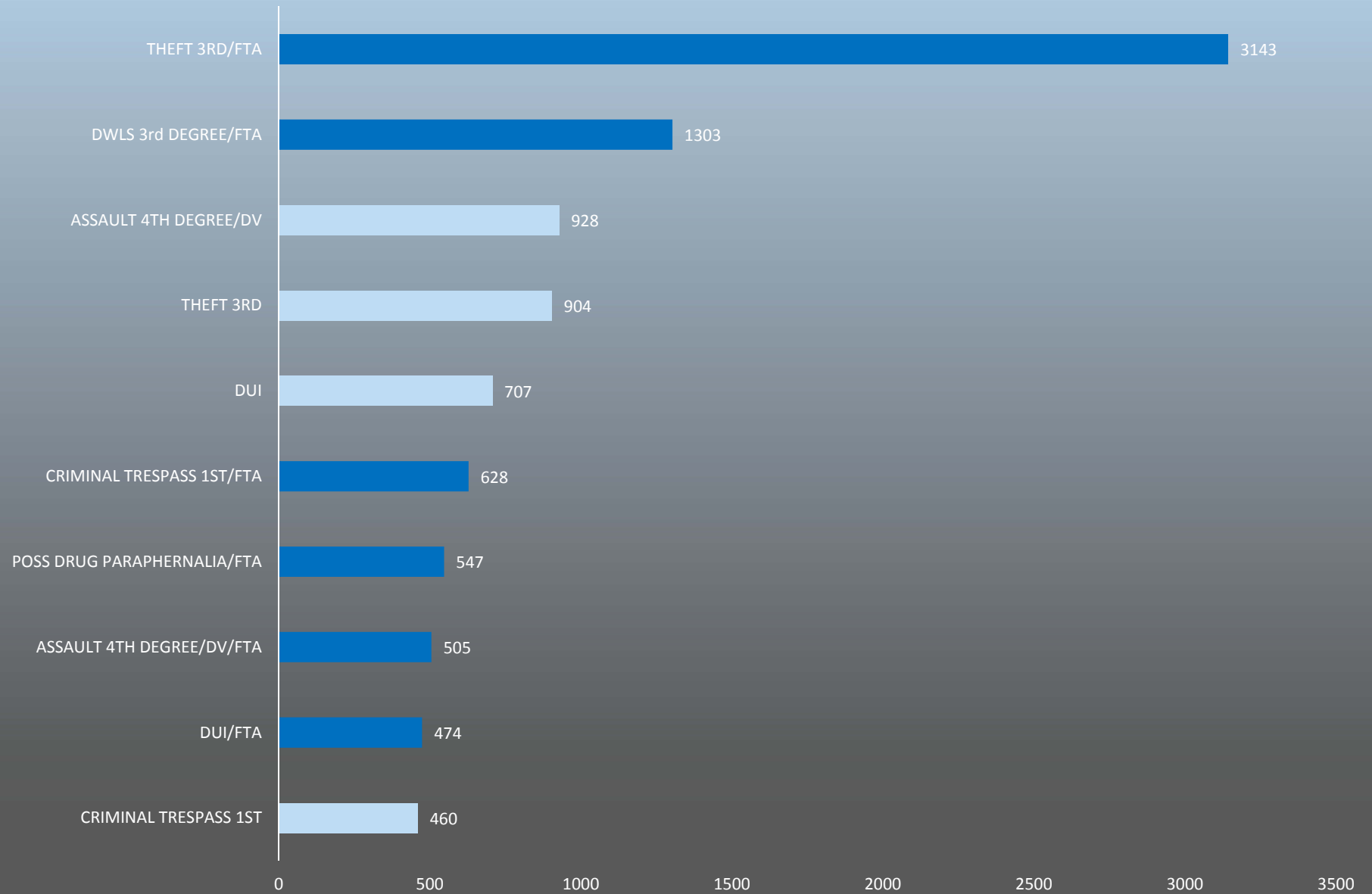
Bookings By Month



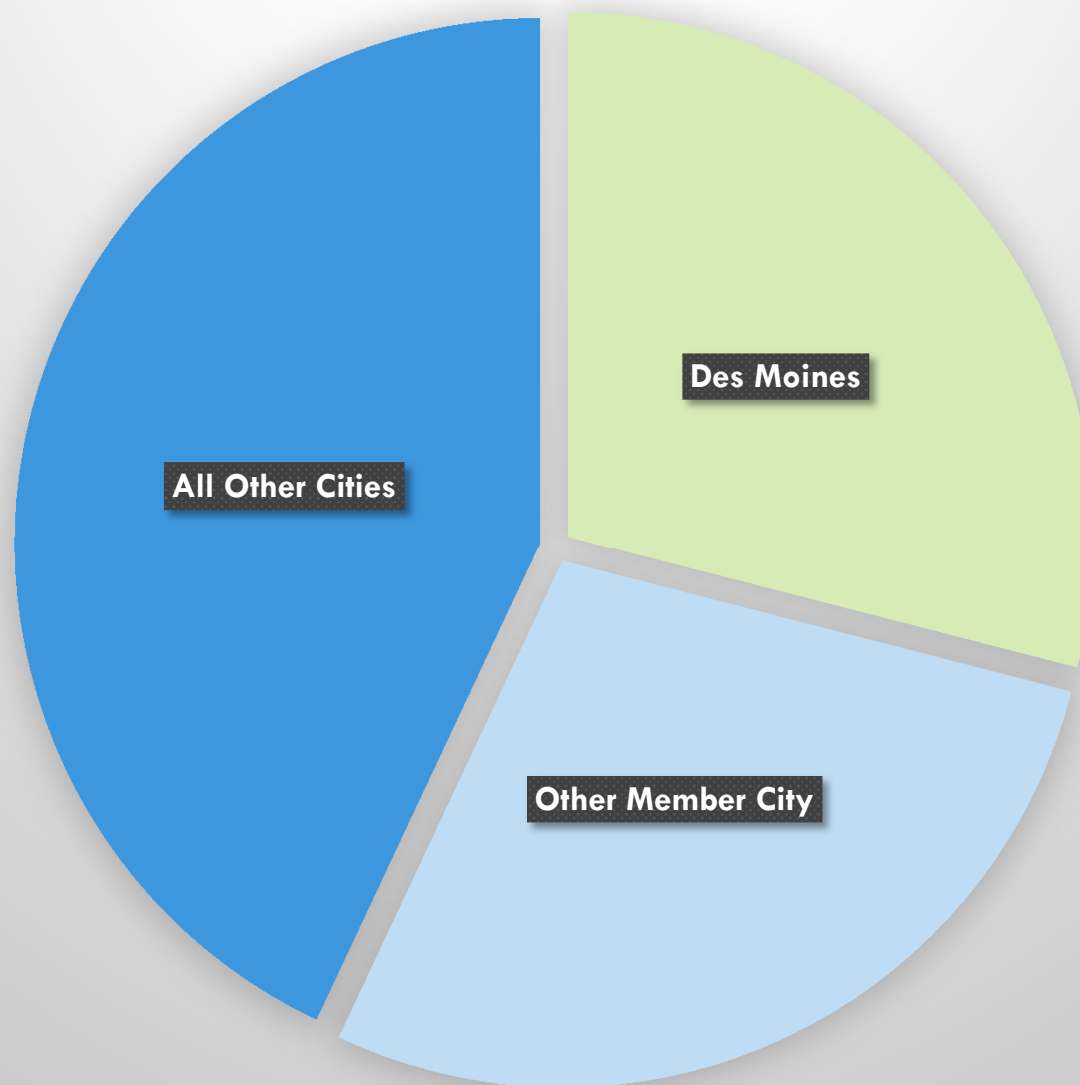
Average Daily Population By Month



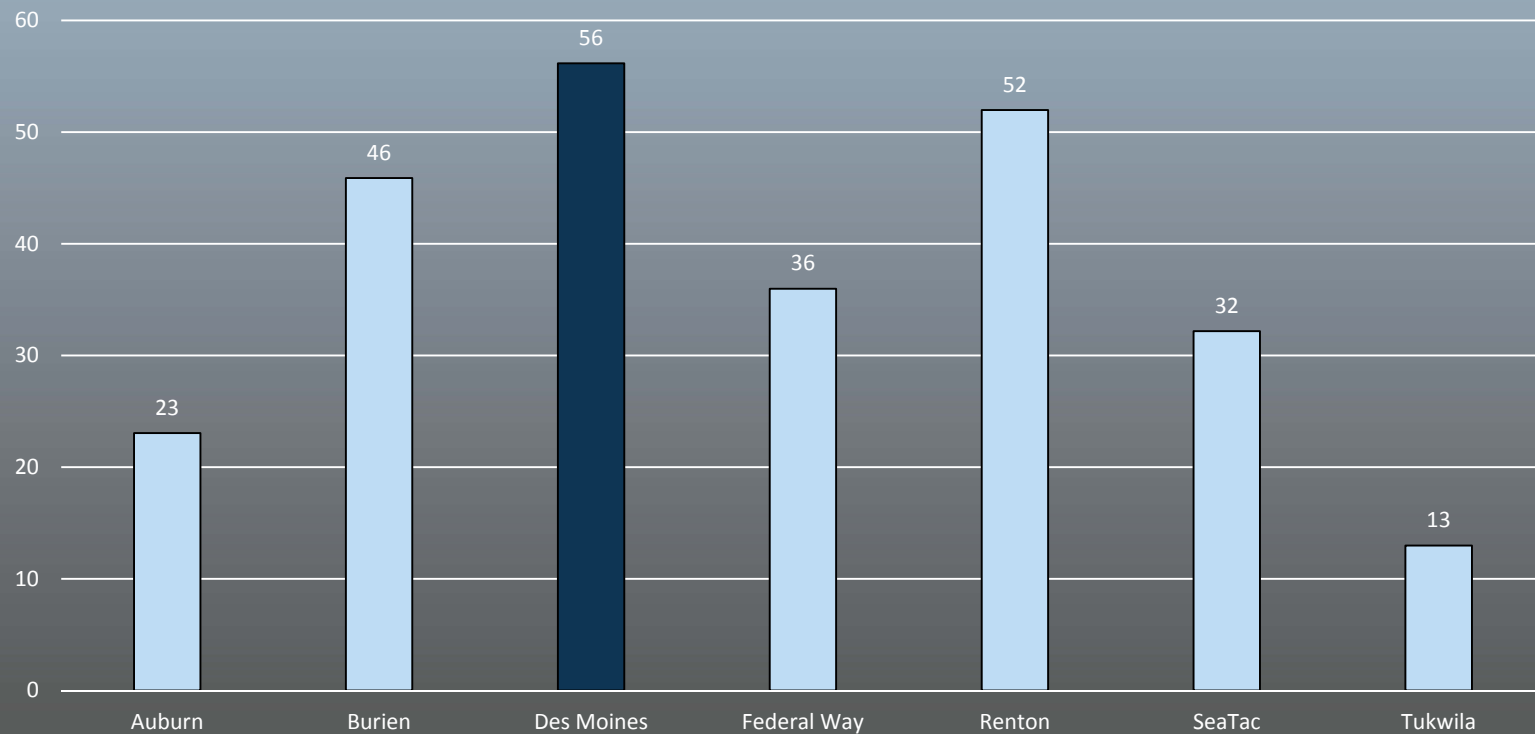
Top Booking Charges - 2017 (YTD)



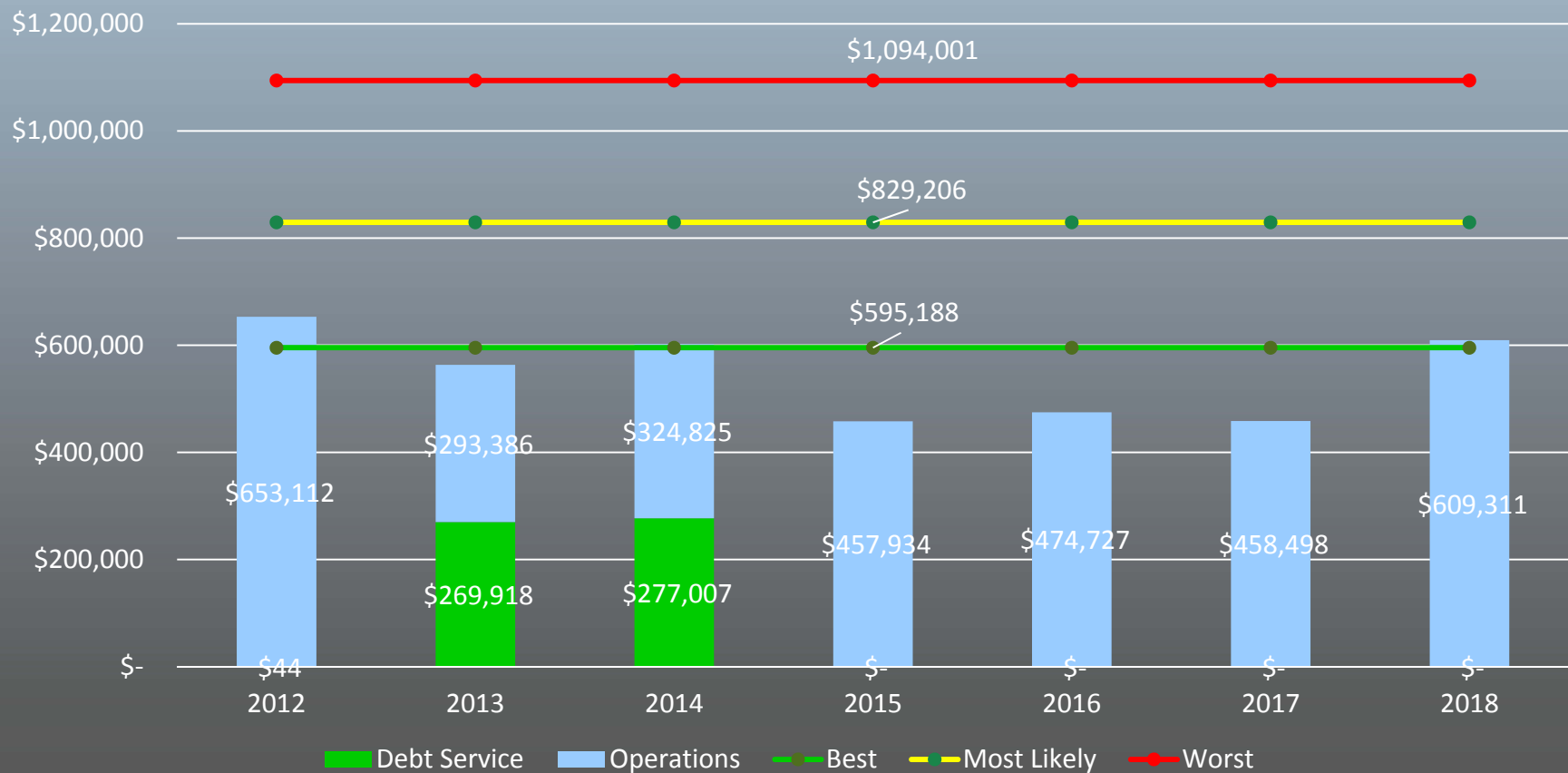
Inmate's City of Residence

OUR CHALLENGES

- 68% of the inmates booked at SCORE are under the influence of drugs or alcohol
 - Of those 68%
 - 80% are under the influence of opiates, heroin, benzos or others drugs (may be in combination with alcohol)
 - 20% are under the influence of alcohol



SIGNIFICANT POPULATION MENTALLY ILL

- Rate of Mental Illness amount adults
 - National Average – 18.19%
 - Washington – 20.77%
- Rate of serious mental illness among adults
 - National Average – 3.7%
 - Washington – 5.14%

DUTIES WHEN RELEASING INMATES

Wakefield v. Thompson, 177 F.3d 1160 (9th Cir. 1999)

Prison inmate with “organic delusional disorder.”

Prescription for two weeks of Navane.

11 days after release, violent outburst, arrest.

“We therefore hold that the state must provide an outgoing prisoner who is receiving and continues to require medication with a supply sufficient to ensure that he has that medication available during the period of time reasonably necessary to permit him to consult a doctor and obtain a new supply.”

LOTS OF GOOD STORIES TO TELL

- Only Jail accredited by Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs
- Only Jail in the state to have 3 certified jail managers and 8 certified jail officers
- One of only five certified government finance officers in the state
- One of only 2 jails in the state to receive accreditation with the National Commission on Correctional Health Care
- Great staff doing amazing work with a extremely high volume of work
