 - DMPD Officer dedicated to Pacific Highway with DEA
 - Met with Flock Safety to get cameras installed along highway later this year
 - Emphasis Patrols along Pac Highway
 - Code Enforcement Efforts continue
4. Covid 19 Update: Director Kirchberg
 - 2 main dominate variants currently
 - King County cases dropped by 17% in last 7 days
 - Hospital cases down in last 7 days
 - Deaths up in last 14 days

 - September is National Preparedness Month
 - Preparing Social media campaign
 - CERT is back Sept 8th starts
